Description: An overview of the California's stormwater regulations including the General Industrial Stormwater Permit, the General Construction Stormwater Permit, Phase I and Phase II municipal permitting and programs addressing non-point source pollution including Confined Animal Feeding Operations and the Irrigated Lands Program. The history of each of the permits will be discussed and the basic requirements of each permit will be outlined.

After completing this course, participants will be able to:

- Understand why there are stringent laws which regulate the discharge of stormwater pollutants,
- Determine which permits a business is required to enroll under and what specific monitoring and BMP requirements apply, and
- Determine when Best Management Practices are needed and what types should be used under different circumstances.

About the Instructor: Peter Peuron has worked as an environmental scientist for 20 years including 11 years overseeing underground storage tank cleanups for the County of Orange, seven years overseeing industrial cleanups for the San Diego Regional Water Quality Control Board and two years performing oversight in the Regional Board's stormwater program. He holds a BS in Soil Science and an MS in Agriculture. Mr. Peuron has performed numerous presentations concerning mechanisms of environmental pollution and environmental regulation at venues such as the UCLA Extension Program and the Association for Environmental Health Sciences, as well as numerous water quality-related workshops and stakeholders meetings.

Intended Audience: This course is designed for professionals seeking a greater understanding of California stormwater regulations and permitting. Those encouraged to attend are consultants, business owners, regulators, environmental activists and attorneys.

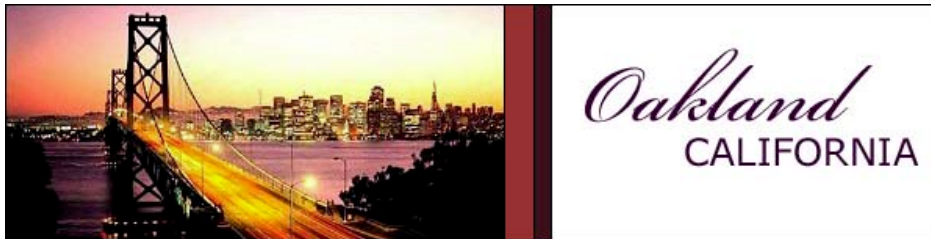

FROM OAKLAND INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT (OAK)

Head southeast toward Airport Dr.
Turn left at Airport Dr.
Slight right to stay on Airport Dr (signs for Doolittle Dr/CA-61/Rentyl Car Center)
Turn left at Doolittle Dr.
Turn right at Hegenberger Rd
Merge onto I880 N via ramp to Downtown Oakland
Take Broadway exit toward Downtown
Keep right at the fork, follow signs for Alameda and merge onto Broadway
Turn left at 10th Street

FROM SAN FRANCISCO AIRPORT (SFO)

Head East
Slight left (signs for all freeways)
Merge onto US-101 N via the ramp to San Francisco
Slight right at I-80 E
Take exit onto I-580 E toward Downtown Oakland/Hayward-Stockton/CA-24
Take the I980 W exit toward Downtown Oakland
Keep right at the fork, follow signs for W Grand Ave/27th Street
Slight left at Northgate Ave.
Turn left at West Grand Ave.
Turn right at Telegraph Ave.
Slight right at Broadway
Turn right at 10th St.

FROM POINTS WEST (via I-80 W)

Merge onto I-80 W
Continue on I-580 E (signs for San Jose/I-580/Downtown Oakland)
Take I-980 W exit toward Downtown Oakland
Keep right at the fork, follow signs for W Grand Ave/27th St
Slight left at Northgate Ave.
Turn left at West Grand Ave.
Turn right at Telegraph Ave.
Slight right at Broadway
Turn right at 10th St.

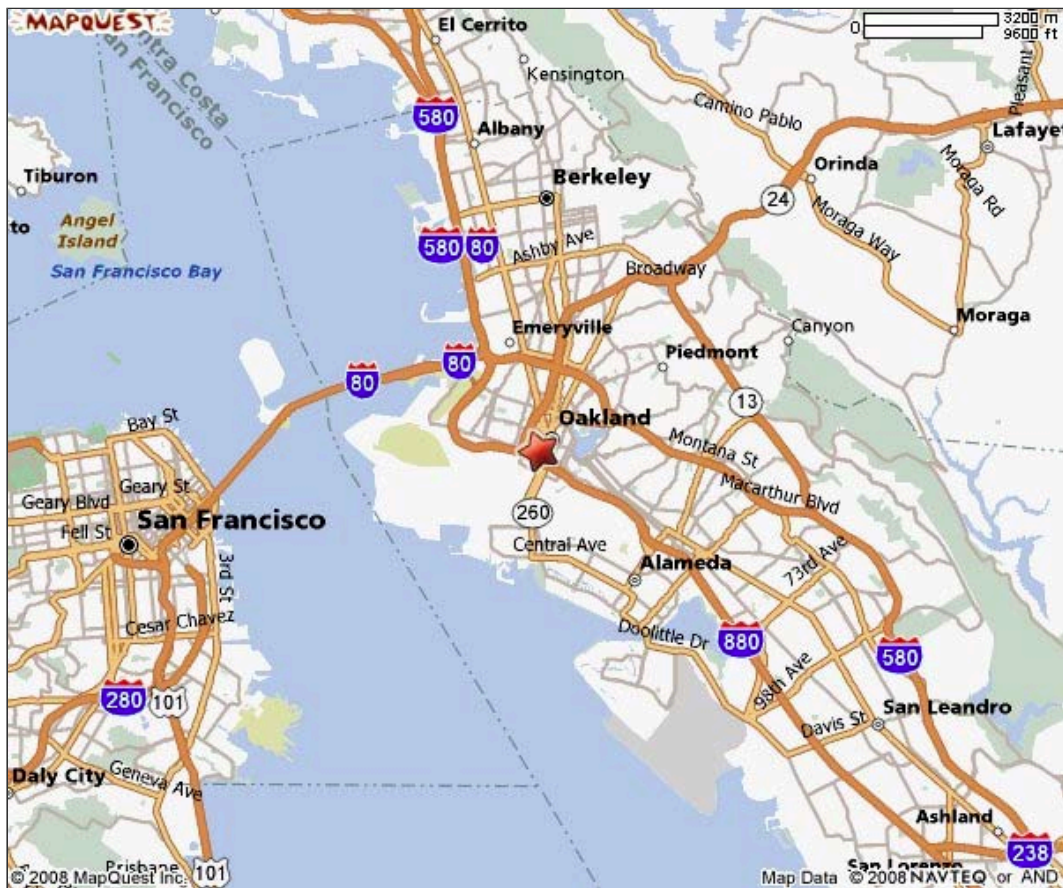
FROM POINTS NORTH (via US-101 S)

Take exit onto I580 E toward Oakland/Richmond Bridge
Take the I-980 W exit toward Downtown Oakland

Slight left at Northgate Ave.
Turn left at West Grand Ave.
Turn right at Telegraph Ave.
Slight right at Broadway
Turn right at 10th St.

FROM POINTS SOUTH (via Santa Cruz)

Merge onto CA-17 N toward Oakland/San Jose
Continue on I-880 N
Take Broadway exit toward Downtown
Keep right at the fork, follow signs for Alameda and merge onto Broadway
Turn left at 10th Street

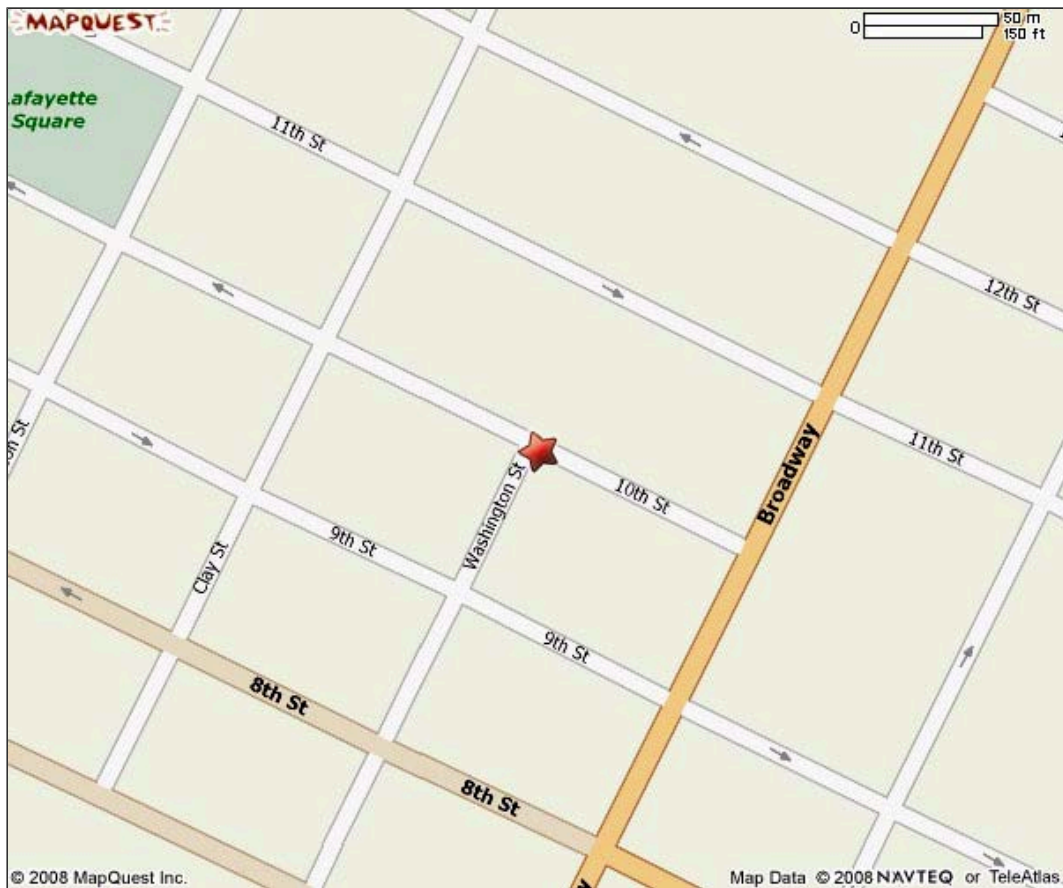
REGIONAL MAP:
